### CHANGES PROPOSED TO INDIA'S LAW ON CHILD LABOUR

On July 02, 2015, the Ministry of Labour and Employment, Government of India, has notified the proposed amendments to the Child Labour (Prohibition and Regulation) Act, 1949. The amendments are aimed at strengthening the prohibition of child labour and ensuring the welfare of children. The proposed changes include:

1. The Act shall apply to all establishments, including those in the unorganized sector.

2. The minimum age for employment shall be 14 years.
