On July 2, 2015, the Ministry of Labour and Employment, Government of India, issued a notification¹ regarding the proposed changes to the Child Labour (Prohibition and Regulation) Act, 1949.

- 6 years and above for the prohibition of child labour.
- 2009 for the prohibition of child labour.
- International Labour Organization (ILO) Convention 182.
